TI PROJECT ON HIV/AIDS for FSWs, MSM & IDUs under DSACS, PSACS & HSACS

TARGETED INTERVENTION PROJECT ON HIV/AIDS in Delhi, Punjab & Haryana.

Since its identification in 1983, HIV/AIDS is the great concern for the governments, policy makers and health professionals around the world, who altogether working for the prevention of spreading of HIV/AIDS and save many lives. According to World Health Organization (WHO) more than 70 million people have been infected with HIV virus and about 37 million people have died of HIV. Globally, approx. 37 million people were living with HIV by the end of 2016 in which the population of young adults (15-49) is 0.8% worldwide, although the burden of epidemic continues to vary considerably between countries and regions. Most of the nations have made health policies in their countries to win the battle against HIV/AIDS and save their citizens. In India, NACO (National Aids Control Organization) is confronting the situation with its support organizations State Aids Control Societies (SACS) in all states and also the NGOs which are working at ground level to support SACS and NACO for the betterment of the situation.

Ganga Social Foundation, being a

responsible NGO, has partnered too with State Aids Control Societies (SACS) of different states to work for prevention of HIV/AIDS and STIs through Targeted Intervention (TI) Program and successfully running the TI Program since 2010. The first partnership for TI Program was done with Delhi State Aids Control Society (DSACS) in the year 2010 for FSW TI. Further GSF has been able to partner with Haryana State Aids Control Society (HSACS) for IDU TI in 2011, Further GSF has been able to partner with Delhi State Aids Control Society (DSACS) for IDU TI in 2013 and Punjab State Aids Control Society (PSACS) in 2014 because of the recommendation for its good work with DSACS and HSACS

TI Program is a unique project with multipronged strategies to serve the targeted beneficiaries effectively.





The main Objectives of TI Program:

1. Reduction in HIV/AIDs and STI infections and re-infection among sex workers, IDUs and MSMs.
2. Increasing awareness about HIV/AIDs and STIs among sex workers, MSMs and IDUs.
3. Promotion of safe sex practices among FSWs and MSMs and their clients. Brining positive changes in behavior of adapting safe sex behavior.

Main components of TI project are:

BCC & IEC activities for mass awareness and behavior change.

Health Care Provision: Treatment facility for STIs.

Counseling: To ease the client pre and post intervention.

Referral system: for HIV testing and treatment at Government facilities.

Supplies: Provision of safe methods like Condoms And Syringes.

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Outreach and Drop In Centre (ODIC) for Drug Abuse Prevention under NISD

The National Institute of Social Defence start a program under NATIONAL ACTION PLAN FOR DRUG DEMAND REDUCTION (NAPDDR for 2018-2025), therein organisations work for "undertaking focused/targeted Intervention Programmes" in remaining 66 identified districts across the country with an aim to reach adolescents and youth in the Community for creating awareness about the harmful effects of Drug Abuse and encourage the drug dependent persons to seek treatment.

OBJECTIVES:

1. To conduct outreach activities among vulnerable adolescents and youth in community for prevention of drug abuse.
2. To provide safe and secure drop-in space for drug users in the community having the provision of screening, assessment and counselling.
3. To provide referral and linkage to treatment and rehabilitation services for drug dependents.



EXPECTED OUTCOMES OF THE PROJECT:

1. The project will reach out to vulnerable drug users in the vicinity of the proposed centre.
2. The drug dependent persons are expected to avail the services of the centre as it is accessible in the community thereby improving their well being.
3. The vulnerable adolescents & youth and drug users in the community will be equipped with information and education on harmful effects of drug use.



WINGS Intervention under India HIV/AIDS Alliance

'WINGS' is an innovative approach design to address the IPV related issues among WWUD. 'WINGS' is an evidence-based, single-session Screening Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment Service (SBIRT) related process. Basic focus of the WINGS lies in harm reduction through empowering women to identify and assess their situation in context of IPV and related risks among WWUD. First and crucial approach of WINGS is creating a non-judgmental framework of communication with WWUD in respect of their intimate relationships and use of substance. This step would enable them for setting their own goals for

improvement in their relationships with a mission to reduce gender based violence. WINGS SBIRT model which guided by Social Cognitive Theory (SCT) is being effectively tested in few countries, i.e., Uzbekistan, Kirgizstan and in India (Pune). This approach focuses on enhancing motivation, self-efficacy, positive intentions and outcomes and on creating social support system and establishing essential services for identifying as well as reducing IPV risk among WWUD/FIDUs. Furthermore, various designs of WWUD/FIDUs have been developed with female and /or mail partners in relationships.


WINGS interventions specifically focus on

1. Empowering and enabling WWUD/FIDUs to assess their IPV related risks
2. Motivating WWUD/FIDUs to develop self efficacy and personal goal towards addressing IPV issues
3. Creating enabling environment and social support system for effective IPV services
4. Establishing effective SBIRT services and ensuring effective access of WWUD/FIDUs to it and other IPV services.

STeP: Smile Twin E-Learning Programme

GSF Along with The Smile Foundation, Running STeP Job oriented course for youth ages 18-28. In a cycle of four months forty learners are instructed by the trained and experienced-Spoken English, Basic-IT, and Personality Development & Retail Management teachers. The classes offer learners a competitive advantage in the workforce by teaching them to

Speak English fluently, specifically for conversational and business dialogues. Ultimately, participants receive better placement in their professions. This program is a catalyst towards development in an area where poverty prevents young people to grab the opportunity toward their career goals.



Skill Development Programme Under NTPC- SAIL Power Co Pvt. Ltd. (CSR)

1. NGO is running under NSPCL Vocational training programme especially for women and girls of weaker section of the society on various trades like Beauty culture & Computer Course
2. In the last 3 year we have trained 360 beneficiaries under this course from March 2013 to February 2016.
3. Exam conducted by Jan Sikshan Sansthan under Prayas And certificate given to beneficiary.





Solid Waste Management under Municipal Corporation of Haryana

1. GSF with support of Municipal Corporation of Faridabad is working on solid waste management programme.
2. We undertake door to door solid waste collection, segregation of garbage to the collection centre, convert biodegradable waste into compost and send non-biodegradable waste for recycling.
3. We generate awareness about environment in primary schools. Our representatives worked on motivating primary teachers to take up the subject conservation of environment with young children.

Blood Donation Camp:-

1. GSF along with Delhi State AIDS Control Society and SBTC (State Blood Transfusion Council) Delhi organizes Voluntary Blood Donation Camp every year in DU for last 8 years.
2. More than 500 students/ University staffs participate and more than 125 units of Blood is collected every year by AIIMS or Other Blood Bank.



COVID-19:- "Team Ganga Social Foundation " Delivered 7500 customized Food Packets AND Mask and Sanatizer to our community needy people under lockdown in Gokal puri, Usman pur and Shakur Pur in Delhi and Samrala chowck Ludhiana which is provided by Smile Foundation and India HIV/AIDS Alliance.
